






Pronounced dow, Tao means "way".

Confucius did not begin as a wise teacher, but had previously worked several normal jobs, including being a clerk and being a shepherd. He eventually went to work for a government entity. He started this career as a small-town governor and moved up the ladder becoming a top-level advisor for the government.





Born 551 B.C.E., Confucius held a job with the government that he chose to leave so that he was able to devote his entire life instructing people how to behave. More than 5 million people, mostly in the Far East and China, now practice Confucianism.










Confucius also teaches that one's family and their family values are quite important. Children are instructed to be respectful to their parents as well as obeying their parents.














- Everything has its beauty but not everyone sees it.






The practice of Buddhism is based on Siddharta Gautama's teachings, who was a Nepali prince living around 500 BCE. In accordance with Buddhist tradition, this young, sheltered prince became shocked when observing life outside of the palace walls, and he left this luxurious life to find answers. He eventually succeeded, and became the Buddha – also referred to as the "Enlightened One". He went on to spend his remaining life of 45 years teaching about the dharma (the path from suffering to liberation) and established the sangha (which was a community of manks)
